

MIXED RACE IDENTIFICATIONS ON THE U.S. CENSUS (2010 AND 2000)

SOME CENSUS RESULTS:

% selecting more than one race:

2000: 2.4%

2010: 2.9%

other comparisons:

Hispanic/Latino:

2000: 12.5%

2010: 16.3%

Black/Af-Am:

2000: 12.3%

2010: 12.6%

Hispanic/Latino population:

White: 53%

Some other race: 36.7%

Black/AfAm: 2.5%

Two or more races: 6%

MULTIPLE RACES: (9 million in 2010)

% of "racial" groups reporting multiple races:

white: 3.2; black 7.4; American Indian/Alaska native: 43.8; Asian 15.3; Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander 55.9; some other race 12.1

White and black: 1.8 million

white and some other race: 1.7 million

white and Asian: 1.6 million

white and American Indian/Alaska Native: 1.4 million
